Additional Information

The Tournament Rules

The teams compete in a Twenty20 round-robin tournament. We recommend players wear pimped cricket shoes. Each team & umpires wear a coloured fleece provided by the organisers.

The Cricket on Ice tournament respects the international MCC laws of cricket, except where:

1. Four teams compete in a round-robin style tournament, with 2 points awarded for a win, 1 point for a tie/draw, no points for a loss.
2. Net Run Rate (NRR) will determine league standings for teams equal on points.
3. Games consist of 20 overs per innings, unless reduced by the officials.
4. Bowlers are limited to 4 overs (or 1/5th of the allotted overs).
5. Games begin at 10am and 1pm.
6. Balls are supplied by the tournament organiser.
7. A ball passing the batsman above the waist on the full at the popping crease is a no-ball.
8. Ball not pitching on the matting (pitch) is a no-ball.
9. Other than pitching off the mat, all no-balls qualify as a "Free-hit".
10. A maximum of two bounces before the ball reaches the batsman are permitted. Any ball exceeding this is deemed a no-ball.
11. A ball passing behind the batsman on the leg is a wide.
12. Fielders are permitted to wear gloves & sunglasses and must wear the clothing provided by the tournament organisers.
13. The Powerplay is the first 6 overs (or one third where a game has been reduced in overs) and only two fielders are permitted outside the circle.
14. During overs 7-20 not more than five fielders are permitted outside the circle.
15. Not more than five fielders are permitted on the leg-side.
16. Not more than two fielders are permitted behind square.
17. Batsmen must wear protective pads.
18. There is no limit to the number of substitutes, but the officials must be made aware of all changes.
19. No more than 11 fielders are permitted on the field of play at any one time.
20. Specified members of the media (photographers/TV) may be tolerated on the field during play.
21. The umpires decision is final and without recourse.

The cricket played is a competitive, but amateur, level and depends a lot on fairness and the spirit of friendship between the teams.

Cricket Dress Code

Cricket whites are requested. Players are recommended to bring pimped cricket shoes and warm gloves. The organiser will provide coloured fleece & COI woolly hats for each team.

Cricket Equipment

The organiser will provide cricket equipment and its use is included in the team fee.

Travelling to St. Moritz

St. Moritz is located approximately 200 km from Zurich. Travelling by car takes about 3 hours, by train about four. A single train ticket costs CHF 75 per person from Zurich airport. Places of interest in St. Moritz are located within walking distance.



Weather Conditions

Because of the nature of an outdoor event held in winter, heavy snowfall, extreme temperatures or rain could jeopardise the matches. The organisers accept no liability for costs incurred for cancelled matches or a cancelled tournament.

Catering on the Lake

The catering service provides an excellent range of hot soups and sausages as well as a dish of the day, Champagne, tea, coffee, beer and soft drinks. The catering section is located in front of the cricket ground, where seating, including some deck chairs, is available to offer spectators a relaxed time on the lake. Each player is offered one lunch meal (incl. one beverage) per day. Champagne, tea, coffee, beer and soft drinks must be paid for individually.
